

# American Community Survey (ACS)




#### 1-Year Data:

All counties, places, and census tracts


# American Community Survey (ACS)

- 2010-2014 5-year estimates(Dec. 2015)


## American Community Survey (ACS): Census Business Builder



Provides selected demographic and economic data from the Census Bureau in a simple to access and use format

- Includes business data by geographic area, such as:
  - Number of doctors' offices
  - Total employment by business type or industry
- Ability to map disability rates

# American Community Survey (ACS): Census Business Builder



# Survey of Income and Program Participation (SIPP) Panel 2014

- Redesigned SIPP Survey beginning Panel 2014
- Administered once a year, with Event History Calendar to facilitate full-year data collection
- Disability Questions
  - 6 ACS questions
  - Additional Questions
    - Developmental delays (age <5)</li>
    - Difficulty playing with other children and limitations with school work (age 5-14)
    - Employment difficulties (age 15+)
- Release anticipated in Summer of 2016

## SIPP SSA Supplement

- Social Security Administration Sponsored
- Telephone interview
- Includes:
  - Retirement plans
  - Employment
  - Pensions
  - Marital history
  - Disability

## **SSA Supplement: Disability**

- Includes select content from prior SIPP topical modules:
  - Work disability history
  - Adult and child functional limitations
  - Improved capture of health conditions
- Release anticipated in Fall of 2016

## Current Population Survey Basic (CPS)

- Asks the same 6 disability questions used in the ACS (and other government surveys)
- Includes civilian noninstitutionalized population ages
   16 and older

This measure of disability is included in Census Bureau reports on health insurance, poverty, and income

### Research Project: Small Area Disability Estimates

- The ACS and SIPP each offer different strengths:
  - ACS: Large Sample, Less Detail
  - SIPP: Smaller Sample, More Detail
- The Census Bureau is investigating methods for combining this survey data to produce state-level modeled disability estimates

## Research Project: Disability Across SIPP & ACS

- The population with disabilities captured within a survey is dependent on the questions used:
  - SIPP has used a broad set of questions, and thus has produced a higher disability rate than the ACS
- What types of disabilities are captured by the ACS measure as per this richer SIPP data?
- Ongoing research to explore this question
