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About the Current Population Survey (CPS)

- ➤ The Current Population Survey (CPS) is a monthly survey of around 60,000 households.
- ➤ The CPS collects employment and unemployment data with significant demographic detail (age, sex, race, educational attainment, etc.)
- ➤ The CPS can append additional questions (supplements) that are useful for collecting information not measured elsewhere




Portion of the population 55 years and over






Employment rates decline after age 55






Disability rates increase with age






A greater portion of those with disabilities are age 65 and over






Labor force participation rates by age and disability status, 2011






Labor force participation rates have remained low for people with disabilities


The unemployment rate has remained relatively high for people with disabilities







People with disabilities are less likely to be in the labor force






Portion of those not in the labor force who want a job






Labor force participation rates by educational attainment

Percent distribution by educational attainment and disability status, 25 years and older








Percent distribution by occupation and disability status, 2011




Employed persons by class of worker and disability status






Employed persons with a disability are more likely to work part time

May 2012 CPS Disability Supplement

- ➤ CPS supplements follow the regular CPS questions and can draw upon the responses to the earlier questions
- The large portion of those with a disability who were not in the labor force brought up several questions that could not be addressed using existing CPS questions
- Extensive outreach was conducted to ensure the supplement questions addressed the most pressing issues
